

When you believe in the power of young people, it is important to stay up to date with theories, resources, policies, and much more. Staying up to date with the "hip" things these days takes a lot of work. Hopefully this part in the newsletter will help with keeping you up to date. ---Anne

Volunteers are the bread and butter of our local program. Without volunteers we would not be able to accomplish what we accomplish, reach as many youths as we do, and provide the great education that we do. Without volunteers doing this great work, we would not be able to shape the next generation of our community. Because of the great work volunteers do, I wanted to share some highlights that you have accomplished this past 4-H year.

- We had over 180 kids enrolled in 4-H who in turn brought 1,278 exhibits to the County Fair. Showcasing all the great work they learned, from you.
- We have 15 club leaders that put in at least 3 hours a month preparing and implementing monthly club meetings. That is around 36 hours a year they give back to the program.
- We had 21 new 4-Hers this past year. That is from the work you have done formally or informally.
- Within club meetings, you give back to your communities yearly.
- Within project meetings, you help kids find their spark and grow in their personal development.
 I could go on and on about the work volunteers do for our local organization. Again, volunteers are the bread and butter of our local program. We thank you for the work you do and are proud to have you be a part of our team. Thank you.





4-H Parent Corner

I want to share some exciting updates from our Fair Awards Committee! There are two major changes this year that we believe everyone will appreciate.

- 1. Changes to Awards Every project will receive an award this year, meaning every 4-Her has the opportunity to walk away with more than just a ribbon. Additionally, we've made some updates to the awards themselves—Showmanship Champions will now receive buckles, and other standard awards have been refreshed.
- 2. We Need Your Help! With more awards, we need more funding. The best way to secure sponsorships is for 4-Hers and their families to reach out to potential donors. I recently sent information and sample scripts to club leaders to assist with these efforts at your next club meeting. We truly appreciate all that families do for the community and understand this is an extra ask, but having 4-Hers take the lead in these conversations will help build valuable skills and strengthen community connections.

The email to club leaders includes detailed information and supporting documents. We've also divided potential sponsors by club to help distribute the effort. However, if you have additional ideas, consider reaching out to local hardware stores, restaurants, insurance agencies, or other small businesses in your area.

Our goal is to have most sponsorships secured by the end of May. We understand that life gets busy, and some potential sponsors may not be contacted—if that happens, please let us know.

Kansas 4-H Camp at Rock Springs Ranch is once again expanding to involve more opportunities for youth. 4-H Camp will be open to all youth ages 6-18. Camp options include traditional overnight camp with 3-night and 5-night options, a 2-night Mini Camp for younger kiddos, Leaders in Training (LIT) and Counselors in Training (CIT) for high school aged youth, Family Camp, and a few new Specialty Camps will be announced soon. Youth can register for any session of interest. 4-H membership is not required to attend camp. Registration and payment will take place directly with Rock Springs Ranch at <u>rockspringsranch4hcamp.org</u>. Registration opens on November 15. It is recommended to register early, as camp sessions will fill on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Harvey County 4-H Development Fund has set up to help pay for part of camp at Rock Spring Ranch. Any registered Harvey County 4-H youth can use coupon code **HVCO4-H25** for \$100 toward the cost of camp.
